Ken Kampe has been involved in development with indigenous peoples in Cambodia, Laos, Thailand, and Vietnam for the past seventeen years. In 1989, he established the Office of Retired Developers and assumed the position of President-for-Life During this period he has worked with a number of NGOs and local movements to increase community-level decision-making authority.
