Citizen Hobo Todd DePastino, 2005-07-08 In the years following the Civil War a veritable army of homeless men swept across America's wageworkers frontier and forged a beguiling and bedeviling counterculture known as hobohemia. Celebrating unfettered masculinity and jealously guarding the American road as the preserve of white manhood hoboese took command of downtown districts and swaggered onto center stage of the new urban culture. Less obviously perhaps they also staked their own claims on the American polity claims that would in fact transform the very entitlements of American citizenship. In this eye-opening work of American history Todd DePastino tells the epic story of hobohemia's rise and fall and crafts a stunning new interpretation of the American century in the process. Drawing on sources ranging from diaries, letters and police reports to movies and memoirs *Citizen Hobo* breathes life into the largely forgotten world of the road but it also crucially shows how the hobo army so haunted the American body politic that it prompted the creation of an entirely new social order and political economy. DePastino shows how hoboese with their reputation as dangers to civilization sexual savages and professional idlers became a cultural and political force influencing the creation of welfare state measures the promotion of mass consumption and the suburbanization of America. *Citizen Hobo's* sweeping retelling of American nationhood in light of enduring struggles over home does more than chart the change from homelessness to houselessness. In its breadth and scope the book offers nothing less than an essential new context for thinking about Americans' struggles against inequality and alienation.

The authors examine policy changes at the local, state, and national levels that can be made to eradicate homelessness but argue that there must be a political will to shift the narrative from blaming the victim to supporting the common good. Expertly combining history, theory, and ethnography, this book is an invaluable resource for those with an interest in housing policy.

Vagrant Nation Risa Goluboff, 2016-01-25 In 1950s America it was remarkably easy for police to arrest almost anyone for almost any reason The criminal justice system and especially the age old law of vagrancy served not only to maintain safety and order but also to enforce conventional standards of morality and propriety A person could be arrested for sporting a beard making a speech or working too little Yet by the end of the 1960s vagrancy laws were discredited and American society was fundamentally transformed What happened In Vagrant Nation Risa Goluboff answers that question by showing how constitutional challenges to vagrancy laws shaped the multiple movements that made the 1960s Vagrancy laws were so broad and flexible that they made it possible for the police to arrest anyone out of place Beats and hippies Communists and Vietnam War protestors racial minorities and civil rights activists gays single women and prostitutes As hundreds of these vagrants and their lawyers challenged vagrancy laws in court the laws became a flashpoint for debates about radically different visions of order and freedom Goluboff's compelling account of those challenges rewrites the history of the civil rights peace gay rights welfare rights sexual and cultural revolutions As Goluboff links the human stories of those arrested to the great controversies of the time she makes coherent an era that often seems chaotic She also powerfully demonstrates how ordinary people with the help of lawyers and judges can change the meaning of the Constitution The Supreme Court's 1972 decision declaring vagrancy laws unconstitutional continues to shape conflicts between police power and constitutional rights including clashes over stop and frisk homelessness sexual freedom and public protests Since the downfall of vagrancy law battles over what if anything should replace it like battles over the legacy of the sixties transformations themselves are far from over

Forgotten Men and Fallen Women Holly Allen, 2015-04-03 During the Great Depression and into the war years the Roosevelt administration sought to transform the political institutional and social contours of the United States One result of the New Deal was the emergence and deployment of a novel set of narratives reflected in social scientific case studies government documents and popular media meant to reorient relationships among gender race sexuality and national political power In Forgotten Men and Fallen Women Holly Allen focuses on the interplay of popular and official narratives of forgotten manhood fallen womanhood and other social and moral archetypes In doing so she explores how federal officials used stories of collective civic identity to enlist popular support for the expansive New Deal state and later for the war effort These stories she argues had practical consequences for federal relief politics The forgotten man identified by Roosevelt in a fireside chat in 1932 for instance was a compelling figure of collective civic identity and the counterpart to the white male breadwinner who was the prime beneficiary of New Deal relief programs He was also associated with women who were blamed either for not supporting their husbands and family at all

owing to laziness shrewishness or infidelity or for supporting them too well by taking their husbands jobs rather than staying at home and allowing the men to work During World War II Allen finds federal policies and programs continued to be shaped by specific gendered stories most centrally the story of the heroic white civilian defender which animated the Office of Civilian Defense and the story of the sacrificial Nisei Japanese American soldier which was used by the War Relocation Authority The Roosevelt administration's engagement with such widely circulating narratives Allen concludes highlights the affective dimensions of U S citizenship and state formation
